Cleveland Fire Authority provides a Fire and Rescue service to an area covering approximately 597km² and consists of 4 unitary authorities (Hartlepool, Middlesbrough, Redcar & Cleveland and Stockton). The current population of this area is 566,150* living in 249,221 dwellings**.

Cleveland is the 7th most densely populated fire authority area in England and suffers from typical inner city type problems. 38% of the wards in the area are assessed as being in the 10% most deprived wards in England and overall Teesside is assessed as being the 3rd most deprived area in the country.

Exceptionally Good Performance

2018/19 compared to 2017/18

- Accidental Dwelling Fires reduced from 111 to 84 (24%);
- Accidental Dwelling Fire Fatalities reduced to 0;
- Primary Fires reduced from 571 to 512 (10%);
- Deliberate Primary Fires decreased by 40 (12%);
- Number of Industrial Commercial Fires reduced by 8 (17%);
- Number of people seriously injured in a Road Traffic Collision reduced from 107 to 94 (12%).

Areas for Improvement

2018/19 compared to 2017/18

- Total deliberate fires have increased by 254 (10%);
- Deliberate Secondary Fires have increased from 2189 to 2483 (13%);
- The number of Malicious False Alarms increased from 64 to 85 (33%);
- People killed in Road Traffic Collisions increased from 4 to 5 (25%)

What have we achieved?

- We have completed over **13,600** Home Fire Safety Visits fitting over **10,800** smoke alarms;
- A huge success in Safe & Well Visits with **7,751** undertaken resulting in interventions to provide additional support since we commenced delivering this initiative;
- Between April and December there were **2215** Safe & Well Visits accepted resulting in 130 falls referrals, 8 dementia referrals, 54 loneliness referrals, 10 smoking referrals & 1 alcohol referral;
- The annual Stay Safe and Warm Campaign was launched again in October for the tenth year in a row;
- Latest figures show another big drop in house fires with the number of call outs falling 24% year on year (April to December 2018);
- As part of Bike Smart Week (19th—25th November) Cleveland Fire Brigade, supported by other emergency services and road safety experts, attended colleges across Cleveland to give advice on how to stay safe on the road.
- 1,139 inspections on Industrial and Commercial premises have been completed;

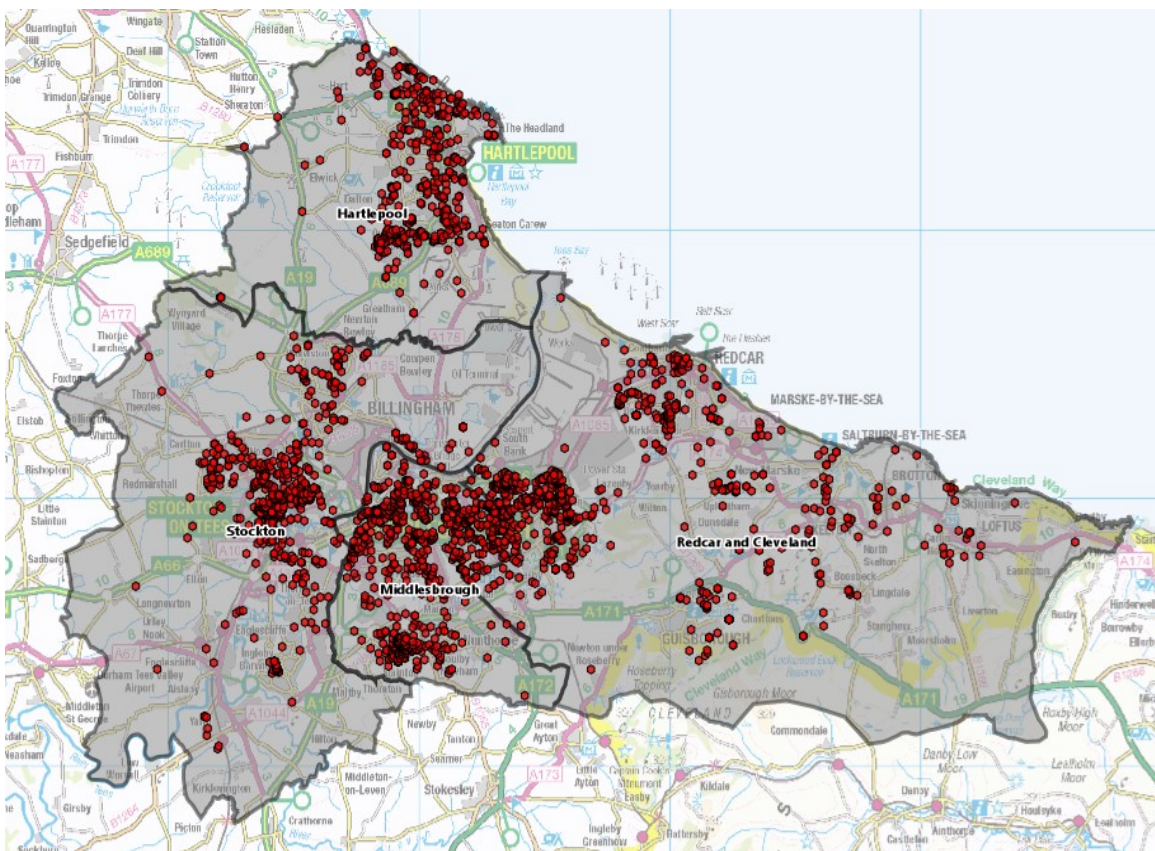

Deliberate Secondary Fires in Cleveland

The map below illustrates the location of Deliberate Secondary Fires in Cleveland for the period April - December 2018.



The proportion of incidents by district:

- 33% (823) in Middlesbrough;
- 32% (746) in Redcar and Cleveland;
- 19% (492) in Stockton;
- 16% (422) in Hartlepool.

The main types were:

- 69% (1705) Refuse;
- 28% (698) Grassland.
