2018/19 Quarterly District Performance Factsheet



The area covered by Hartlepool lies to the North of Cleveland Fire Authority area and consists of eleven local wards. These wards range from areas of high social deprivation to areas of executive housing. The current population is 93,019* living in 42,626** dwellings.

Specific risks within the District area include:

A19, Hartlepool Power Station, Marina Development, Retail Parks and Light Engineering, Middleton Grange Shopping Centre, Dock Area, University of Hartlepool Hospital.

WHAT NEXT?

- We will identify hotspots for Accidental Dwellings, False Alarm Good Intentions and F3 fires to help concentrate resources;
- We are continuing to focus on reducing fires in the home by delivering our Home Safety Strategy and fire safety advice to people in their own homes;
- We will continue to tackle Secondary Fires and Anti Social Behaviour in our neighbourhoods;
- We will be requesting more work in Secondary Schools in order to educate young teenagers on the danger of fire setting.

Exceptionally Good Performance

2018/19 compared to 2017/18

- 11% (4) reduction in Deliberate Primary Fires;
- Accidental Dwelling Fire Fatalities and Injuries remained at 0;
- 22% (8) decrease in RTCs attended by the Brigade;
- People seriously injured in RTCs reduced by 56% (10).

Areas for Improvement

2018/19 compared to 2017/18

- Accidental Dwelling Fires increased by 17% (2), an increase of £50,000 to the economy;
- Deliberate Secondary Fires have increased from 236 to 266 (13%);
- Total Deliberate Fires increased by 26 (10%);
- Number of Secondary Fires increased from 283 to 324 (14).

What have we achieved?

- Community Action Day around Dent St in August in association with Hartlepool Borough Council to clean up the area including HFSVs and leaflet drops;
- Several hot strikes completed around the town following Accidental Dwelling Fires and False Alarm Good Intentions in Dwellings

Home Fire Safety Visits

- We have completed 1545 Home Fire Safety Visits fitting 1071 Smoke Alarms;
- We have completed 402 Home Safety Visits to our most vulnerable age range of 65+ (26% of all HFSVs completed during this period);

Safe and Well Visits

- A successful uptake of Safe and Well Visits with 931 undertaken since we commenced delivery of the initiative (October 2016);
- 200 Safe & Well Visits have been undertaken during Quarter 2, 2018 (34% of those offered being accepted).

Referrals

- 17x fall referrals;
- 7x dementia referrals;
- 12x loneliness referrals;
- 5x smoking referrals.

Provision of equipment

- 3x Slip Mats;
- 3x Push Lights;
- 10x Reacher 24;
- 3x Reacher 36.

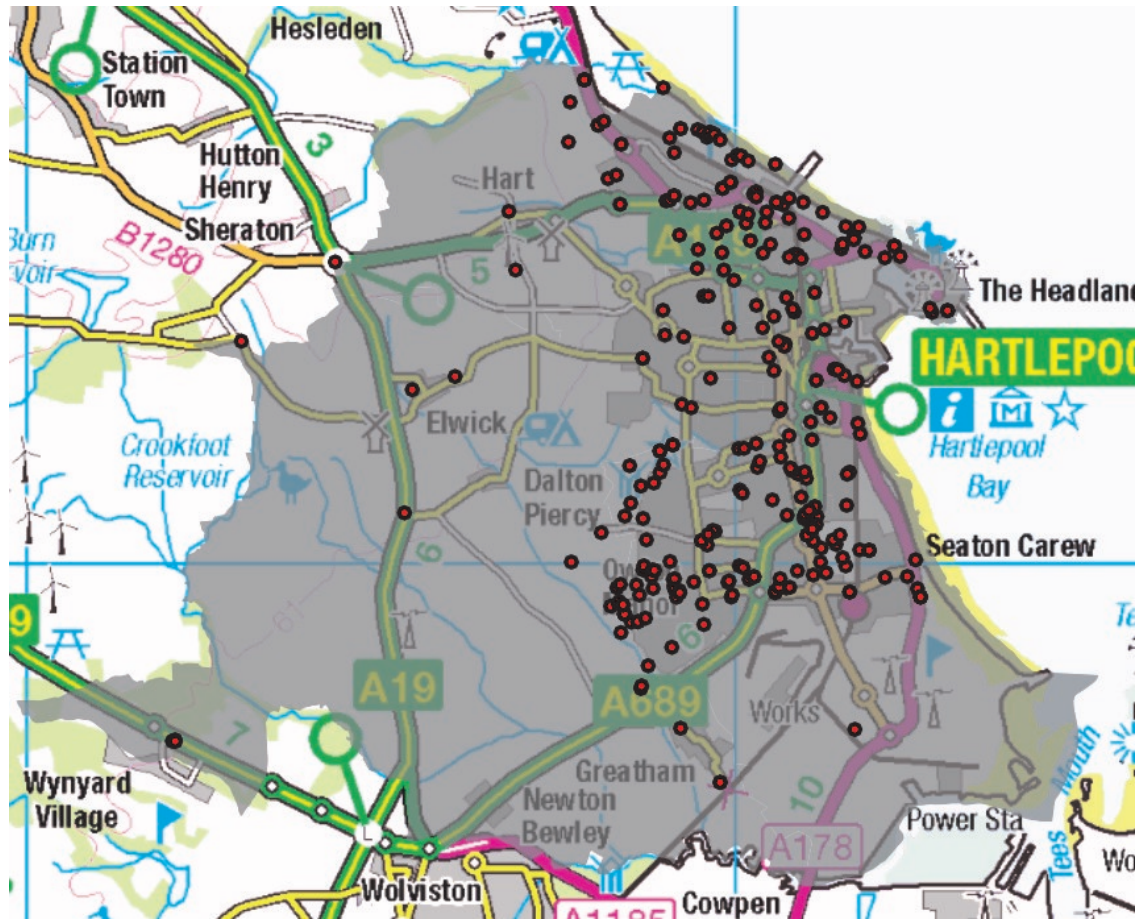
HEADLAND

Deliberate Secondary Fires in Hartlepool

The map below illustrates the location of all Deliberate Secondary Fires in Hartlepool District for the period April - September 2018.



The wards with the highest proportion of Deliberate Secondary Fire incidents:

- 19% (51) in De Bruce;
- 18% (47) in Headland and Harbour;
- 17% (45) in Seaton;
- 16% (43) in Manor House.

The main types were:

- 56% (150) Refuse;
- 39% (105) Grassland.
